Atlanta Junior Rowing Association (AJRA) rower Joey Gabianelli -- a senior at the Galloway School in Atlanta -- has been named to US Rowing Association's Scholastic Honor Roll.

The US Rowing Scholastic Honor Roll recognizes high school seniors who have excelled in both academics and rowing. Applicants must be US Rowing members, have rowed or served as coxswain at least one year, and successfully competed at or above the league or regional level. This is the 19th year of the award. US Rowing is a nonprofit organization recognized by the US Olympic Committee as the governing body of the sport of rowing in the United States.

The US Rowing Youth Advisory Committee selected the winners based on a numerical ranking of their grades in core academic classes, ACT or SAT scores, and class rank, if applicable. Fifty-two student athletes nationwide earned Scholastic Honor Roll status for 2009-2010, and 52 earned honorable mention Scholastic Honor Roll accolades. Overall, 292 student-athletes from 128 rowing clubs and schools from around the country applied for the 2009-2010 US Rowing Scholastic Honor Roll, marking the largest pool of applicants in the award's history.

Gabianelli has been a member of AJRA Varsity Men's squad for the past four years. He is a son of Nancy and Gino Gabianelli of Atlanta.
